What is this indicator?

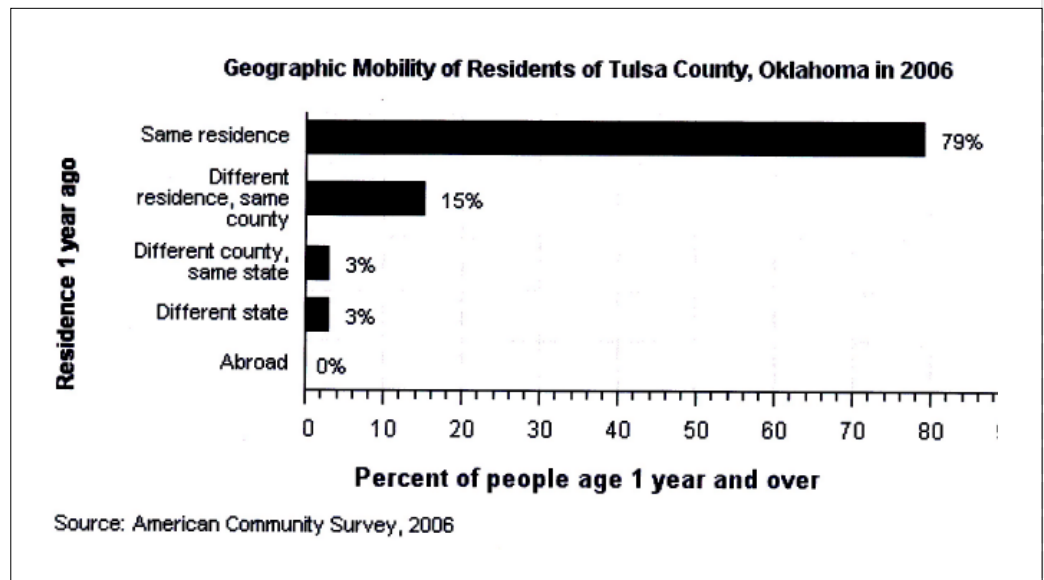
The American Community Survey (ACS) includes data on the annual rate of moving, and the characteristics of movers and nonmovers by type of move.

What are the key findings?

In 2006, 79% of the people at least one year old living in Tulsa County were living in the same residence one year earlier; 15% had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 3% from another county in the same state, 3% from another state, and less than 0.5% from abroad.

In Oklahoma, 80% of the people at least one year old living were living in the same residence one year earlier; 12% had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 4% from another county in the same state, 3% from another state, and less than 0.5% from abroad.

Why is this important?

Mobility of a population increases infrastructure stresses within a community, and decreases the stability of household and family units (Schachter, 2001). Further exploration of the association of moves with education, race, household income, and employment would benefit the Tulsa community in planning.
