WHO WE ARE Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) is a rapid rehousing program of the Community Service Council funded by a U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs grant. Using the Housing First model, we provide temporary intervention and short-term assistance to very low-income veteran families who are homeless or facing eviction.

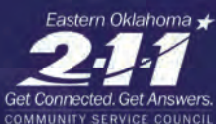

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- ★ Veterans who served in the active military *and* any discharge other than dishonorable;
- ★ Household income is below 50% of the area median income; *and*
- ★ Veteran is literally homeless or imminently facing eviction.



Additional screening may be required.
