HAVE YOU RECEIVED A NOTICE FROM YOUR LANDLORD OR A SUMMONS TO COURT?

- Call 2-1-1 immediately to learn about the resources and support available to you. *Llame al 2-1-1 para obtener ayuda. Apoyo en diferentes idiomas.*
- 211 Eastern Oklahoma can connect you with legal resources to help you through the eviction process. Even if you have not paid your rent, resources are available to help you with advice or representation.
- If you receive a summons to court, go to your court date. Even if you believe you will be evicted, it is your opportunity to tell the judge about your situation.
- You can also seek legal assistance by submitting your information at OKLegalConnect.org. Mothers who live in North Tulsa can also seek assistance from StillSheRises.org
- Eviction proceedings are temporarily moving to the Family Justice Center, 500 W. Archer St.
- Tenants should call the Tulsa County District Court to check the time of your hearing. The court has changed the times of some hearings.
