ABOUT THE PANELISTS



BECKY GLIGO serves as the Executive Director for Housing Solutions, a new nonprofit founded to serve as the lead agency for A Way Home for Tulsa. In her role with Housing Solutions, Becky has overseen the implementation of the community-wide strategic plan to end homelessness and has taken the lead on coordinating A Way Home for Tulsa's response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Previously, Becky served as the Housing Policy Director for the City of Tulsa where she was responsible for working with city and state housing agencies, nonprofit entities, philanthropic organizations, and developers to achieve key outcomes of neighborhood revitalization and affordable housing preservation and development.



ELIAN HURTADO is a community leader passionate about making affordable housing possible for all through financial literacy. She is currently the Director of Client Services with Green Country Tulsa Habitat for Humanity. Prior to this role, Elian worked in the banking industry for 16 years as a leading bilingual mortgage expert. Today, she applies her financial knowledge, skills and most importantly, her passion, to helping low-income families become homeowners, in partnership with a global organization that feels exactly as she does. Elian says she is honored Habitat for Humanity is her partner in fulfilling her life's purpose of making sure everyone has a place to call home.



KRISTIN MAUN is a native Tulsan who returned home after practicing law in Kansas to work on the City of Tulsa's Affordable Housing Strategy, which is a living document designed to guide policy, process and decision making for housing in Tulsa. An important part of this work is addressing historical and current housing inequities. Kristin works to support the strategy, promoting economic growth and innovation while ensuring all Tulsans have access to decent, safe and appropriate housing that meets their needs. Kristin is passionate about housing policy and working with partners to create quality, affordable housing opportunities for all Tulsans.



RACHEL RUNFOLA has been with the Community Service Council since February 2014. As the Director of Veteran Programs, she oversees both the Supportive Services for Veterans Families (SSVF) Program and the Oklahoma Veteran Alliance (OKVA). The SSVF program is funded through a Department of Veterans Affairs grant and concentrates on housing low-income veterans and their families experiencing homelessness. The Oklahoma Veteran Alliance is a veteran network group focusing on assisting veterans to connect to resources and services through the Oklahoma Veteran Connections platform. Rachel is a U.S. Air Force veteran, serving 5 ½ years active duty.
